From a general lack of awareness to methods of investigating and prosecuting these crimes, current and future trends in the use of computers for illicit activity are problematic for intelligence and law enforcement professionals. This presentation aims to expose the illicit use and danger of a variety of Internet technologies, including hidden TOR, social networking, alternative reality gaming, and others. Through specific case studies, attendees will gain an awareness of the types of threats these technologies pose.
