ULC members must be lawyers, and each state has an appointment process selecting Commissioners. The Criminal History Records Accuracy Committee was established to create model legislation to be presented to State Legislatures for adoption throughout the country. If enacted, the model legislation (as currently drafted) could have a significant impact on state criminal history repository operations, as it would significantly alter how criminal histories are compiled, maintained, and disseminated for noncriminal justice purposes.
