<p><b>8:00A–9:00A</b></p>	<p><b>NCS-X/NIBRS Funding, Research, and Implementation Planning</b> The Bureau of Justice Statistics, in partnership with the FBI’s CJIS Division, is spearheading the National Crime Statistics Exchange (NCS-X), a program designed to generate nationally-representative incident-based data on crimes reported to law enforcement agencies. NCS-X will leverage the FBI’s existing National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS) by recruiting a sample of 400 law enforcement agencies to supplement the existing NIBRS data by providing their incident data to their state (or the federal) NIBRS data collection program.</p> <p>When data from these 400 agencies are combined with data from the 6,600+ agencies that currently report NIBRS data to the FBI, NIBRS will be able to produce national estimates of crime that can be disaggregated by victim-offender characteristics, the circumstances of the event, victim-offender relationship, and other important elements of criminal events. Nationally representative NIBRS data will increase our nation’s ability to monitor, respond to, and prevent crime by allowing NIBRS to produce timely, detailed, and accurate national measures of crime incidents. SEARCH is working with BJS and FBI CJIS to implement the NCS-X initiative, and this session addresses this effort.</p> <p><b><u>Moderator</u></b> <b>Mr. David J. This workshop will focus on work SEARCH is undertaking with several states in developing process and workflow measures to help repositories define universal metrics to monitor data quality and timeliness of arrest reporting from contributing law enforcement agencies and disposition reporting by contributing courts. In addition to these process metrics, this workshop will also focus on research on a variety of other issues, including (a) profiling first-time arrestee cohorts over time and across jurisdictions, (b) profiling active offender populations over time and across jurisdictions, (c) research assessing</p>
