Proclamation

WHEREAS, SEARCH provides a forum for state officials to discuss, analyze, and strategize on key policy, operational, and technical issues that impact justice information sharing;

WHEREAS, this forum is a Membership Group of governor appointees who are responsible for criminal justice information sharing and management, and who serve as the consensus "voice of the states," whereby States articulate their justice information management needs and priorities, and provide thought leadership on critical and timely justice information sharing issues;

WHEREAS, the SEARCH Board of Directors recognizes and appreciates the extraordinary and sustained contributions of individual appointees to the SEARCH Membership Group;

WHEREAS, a Member's length of service to and participation in SEARCH is symbolic not only of the value of that Member to the organization, but also of the Member's key contributions;

*WHEREAS, **LIANE MORIYAMA** has been an appointed Member of the SEARCH Membership Group representing the State of Hawaii since **June 1992**, and has since that time been an active participant and leader in SEARCH activities, including service on the Board of Directors;*

WHEREAS, Ms. Moriyama is renowned for her energy, warmth, and consensus-building, her willingness to step forward and take on additional tasks on behalf of the Membership, and for being an effective, tireless supporter of SEARCH at both the state and federal levels;

WHEREAS, Ms. Moriyama advocates for the importance and value of state-based criminal identification systems, having put tremendous effort into implementing Hawaii's criminal history record information system and serving in leadership positions on partner organizations and bodies, such as the National Crime Prevention and Privacy Compact Council;

WHEREAS, Ms. Moriyama was instrumental in the formation of the Open Justice Broker Consortium, an organization dedicated to improving justice information sharing for local and state governments, and has been an active leader and advocate of the organization since then;

WHEREAS, the SEARCH Board selected Ms. Moriyama as the 2000 recipient of the Board of Directors Award for Meritorious Service in recognition of her outstanding work on behalf of SEARCH and criminal justice information systems, policy, and statistics nationally;

WHEREAS, Ms. Moriyama is retiring this month as Administrator of the Hawaii Criminal Justice Data Center, Department of the Attorney General, after nearly four decades of service;

*NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of SEARCH, The National Consortium for Justice Information and Statistics, to recognize the many valuable contributions that **LIANE MORIYAMA** has made to SEARCH and to extend its appreciation for **25 years** of dedicated service and leadership.*
